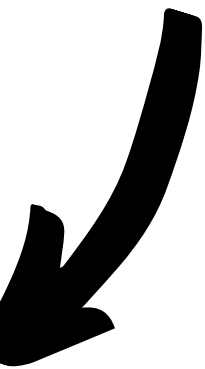

OVERVIEW: RABBIT DAMAGE



RULE OF RABBITS

Any newly planted seedlings must be tasted!

PREVENT DAMAGE

Exclude

- Fencing
- Traps

Deterrents

- Foul smells like fox urine, blood meal
- Bad taste chili powder or cayenne pepper
- Motion lights, water, movement
- Pets like dog or cat





HERE'S WHAT YOU WILL NEED

EQUIPMENT

- 1 Blender
- 2 Funnel
- 3 Coffee Filter
- 4 Sprayer or bottle with spray dispenser



INGREDIENTS

- 1 Large handful dried hot peppers
- 2 Garlic, 4-5 cloves
- 3 Water to fill blender
- 4 2 teaspoons Sticker Spreader Surfactant per gallon of liquid
(*use Sticker Spreader as directed on the instructions of the bottle, if using a different brand, follow that brand's instructions only)





DIRECTIONS

- 1 Remove any green tops of peppers
- 2 Peel garlic
- 3 Blend dried peppers, garlic and water in blender
- 4 Allow to stand at room temperature for 24 hours
- 5 Using a funnel and coffee filter, strain liquid into storage container (This can take a few hours to completely strain all the liquid through the filter)
- 6 Reserve the sediment left in the coffee filter





DIRECTIONS CONTINUED

- Fill sprayer
- Add Sticker Spreader Surfactant
- Apply spray to garden plants
- Re-apply after rain

NOTE ON STICKER SPREADER

Sticker Spreader works by helping spray adhere to the plant and has been scientifically tested to not damage plants when used according to directions.

There are a variety of brands you may purchase. Use the product according to the instructions on the label.

DO NOT use other materials as a substitute.





HOT PEPPER SAUCE

ADDED VALUE!

Use the pepper sediment from straining blended peppers for this tasty pepper sauce

HOW TO MAKE HOT PEPPER SAUCE

Combine sediment collected in coffee filter

3 Tablespoons cider vinegar

1 Tablespoon sugar

Stir to blend
